From the Principal

We have continued to have a wonderful start to our school year — with students happy and engaged with their teachers and new classes, beginning to develop learning routines, enjoying time together, and investigating in the playground. The new shade structures are a great success with lots of our young people enjoying playing there. Our older students are still enjoying the new swings and climbing equipment too.

Last year our chicken caravan was moved to a new area of the Field Study Centre to provide opportunity for renewal and rejuvenation of the chicken paddock. Yesterday it was great to see the excitement from the new chickens coming back into the carpark paddock. Our chickens are very loved by our community, and it was lovely to see so many families engaging with the chickens, and the staff of the Agricultural Learning Centre during pick up time.

I must admit that I have missed the chicken wrangling as the escapees wander around the carpark and the school. While it is not an ideal school issue – it is lots of fun and brings enjoyment to our school community.

Did you know that this term we only have five full weeks of learning? SAFEGUARDING TRAINING IN OUR SCHOOLS

Are you interested in volunteering in our school?

If so, you will need to complete your safeguarding training before working with any children or young people this year. Make sure you save the certificate to show you have completed it. You can either present it to the school office who will photocopy it, or email the school a copy https://example.com/hagley.Farm.Primary@decyp.tas.gov.au

The training is compulsory under new laws designed to better safeguard children and young people in Tasmania. It will help you understand what to do if you believe a child or young person is or may be being harmed, and to make sure you are doing all you can to prevent this from happening. The training will also tell you what you must report under the new laws.

If you volunteer in the class, on an excursion, at a school event, in the library or the canteen you will need to do this training.

To complete your training, visit <u>Safeguarding Training</u> or scan the QR code on the poster in our newsletter and on our school's main office doors. The training is a 13-minute video, designed to help you better understand what to do if you hold concerns for a child's safety and to understand your Mandatory reporting obligations.

Thank you for leading the way in caring for our children and keeping our young people safe so that they can focus on living bright lives with positive futures.

If you have difficulties accessing the training material, the school will be providing three opportunities to do this training in a group environment. These sessions will be conducted by Lauren Beams, Assistant Principal and Safeguarding Lead. Lauren will give some additional information, be on hand to answer any questions and show the video to the group. At the conclusion of the session, Lauren will send through participants names to the Safeguarding Office to obtain their certificates. These sessions will be held on the following three dates and times, please note these are not appropriate sessions for children to attend.

- Wednesday the 21st at 2.30pm in the school's Multi-Purpose room (where LiL and Japanese are held)
- Thursday the 22nd at 9.00 am in the school library
- Tuesday the 27th (Welcome Back BBQ) from 5.30 to 6.00pm in the library. This session will also double as a CANAVS assistance drop in session.

SCHOOL NURSE

I hope this message finds you well and that your child/ren are settling in nicely to term 1 at Hagley Farm Primary School. My name is Amy Bradley, and I am excited to be rejoining your school community as the School Health Nurse for the 2024 school year! I am looking forward to working with your children every Tuesday.

Throughout the year, I will be focusing on many health education and promotion activities covering a wide range of topics. It is my aim to empower your children with the knowledge and skills they need to make informed choices and lead healthy lives.

I will be conducting Kindergarten Health Checks for all kindergarten students. If there are any specific concerns regarding vision and hearing, I am also able to conduct screenings for all primary school students upon request. Please note that consent forms must be signed by a parent/guardian prior to any assessments, including kindergarten health assessments.

Just a reminder all students with health issues or who require medication (prescribed, non-prescribed and self-administered) while at school must have an up-to-date annual Medical Action Plan. Administration of medication must be authorised by a parent/guardian/carer using the Authorisation for Administration of Student Medication Form A-non-prescribed for non-prescription medications and for prescribed medication, parent/guardian/carer must ensure that Administration of Student Medication Form B-prescribed is completed by a doctor, pharmacist, or practice nurse and signed by the parent/guardian/carer.
