From the Principal

We have continued to have a positive and settled start to our term. There is high engagement in learning across all of our classes. As we settle into the school year there are a few reminders we need to provide for our parent community.

- Firstly, attendance at school is critically important. When students are unwell, of course they should not be at school. However, we encourage every student to be at school every day that they can be. You would be surprised how much important learning can be missed in just one day.
- We also request that parents communicate with the school office, or with teachers directly, to let us know why students are away. There are very strict DECYP policies and procedures about monitoring student attendance, and explanations from parents and carers helps us to follow these.
- Duty of care from school staff starts at 8.30, so please be aware of this when dropping children to school.
- Every child needs to wear a school hat when outdoors during Term 1 and 4. We only have a small supply of spare hats, so please ensure your child/ children are provided with one and that it is clearly named. Our policy is No Hat – No Play – stay in the shade. This is a part of our Sun Safe Policy.
- Our school uniform is highly important to our school culture of respect, connection and belonging. We have a strong focus on all students wearing their uniform with respect. This means that we require:



- Navy socks
- Socks that do not have branding on them.
- ❖ A school hat –No caps.
- Uniform items that are listed in the Uniform Policy – ratified by the School Association.
- When representing the school (sport, music, choir, maths, basketball etc) all school uniform is required.
- The car park and drop off area can be a bit confusing, especially for new parents. Within this newsletter we have placed a map to show where parents are able to park, and where to drop off and pick up. Please look at this carefully and be mindful of this when coming to the school. Also please always approach the car park slowly our speed limit is 10km/h.


This term we have had a number of complaints about drivers not being vigilant towards students walking towards the carpark and using the crossing area. There have been some situations reported that drivers are parked across the crossing, and that drivers have driven through the crossing while students are waiting or beginning to cross. Please ensure that our students and families walking through the carpark are treated as a priority and given complete safety to walk through. Please ensure that if you are using our Drop Off and Pick Up area that you are doing just this. This space is for a quick drop off and a quick pick up. Please do not use this space as a waiting area especially at the end of the day for pick up. This creates a back log and traffic jam. This then creates parents trying to move through and past the cars that are stopped and becomes unsafe for everyone. If you are an early arrival at the end of the school day, please use the car park spaces to wait, and then use the drive through.

WELCOME BACK BBQ



SAFEGUARDING TRAINING IN OUR SCHOOLS

Are you interested in volunteering in our school?

If so, you will need to complete your safeguarding training before working with any children or young people this year. Make sure you save the certificate to show you have completed it. You can either present it to the school office who will photocopy it, or email the school a copy Hagley.Farm.Primary@decyp.tas.gov.au

The training is compulsory under new laws designed to better safeguard children and young people in Tasmania. It will help you understand what to do if you believe a child or young person is or may be being harmed, and to make sure you are doing all you can to prevent this from happening. The training will also tell you what you must report under the new laws.

If you volunteer in the class, on an excursion, at a school event, in the library or the canteen you will need to do this training.

To complete your training, visit <u>Safeguarding Training</u> or scan the QR code on the poster in our newsletter and on our school's main office doors. The training is a 13-minute video, designed to help you better understand what to do if you hold concerns for a child's safety and to understand your Mandatory reporting obligations.

Thank you for leading the way in caring for our children and keeping our young people safe so that they can focus on living bright lives with positive futures.

If you have difficulties accessing the training material, the school will be providing three opportunities to do this training in a group environment. These sessions will be conducted by Lauren Beams, Assistant Principal and Safeguarding Lead. Lauren will give some additional information, be on hand to answer any questions and show the video to the group. At the conclusion of the session, Lauren will send through participants names to the Safeguarding Office to obtain their certificates. These sessions will be held on the following three dates and times, please note these are not appropriate sessions for children to attend.

- Wednesday the 21st at 2.30pm in the school's Multi-Purpose room (where LiL and Japanese are held)
- Thursday the 22nd at 9.00 am in the school library
- Tuesday the 27th (Welcome Back BBQ) from 5.30 to 6.00pm in the library. This session will also double as a CANAVS assistance drop in session.
