From the Principal

Hello everyone,

Last week it was really exciting to host our first Whole School Assembly for 2024, where we celebrated learning, growth and achievement with our students and families. Merit Certificates were presented to students, aligned with the school Values of Connection, Respect, Courage, Growth and Responsibility. Congratulations to the students who were recognised for their achievements.

We also celebrated the induction of our new House Captains, and the Student Executive. Congratulations to everyone who participated in the nomination process, including giving speeches to the Primary students. Congratulations to House Captains — Dry: Jamie and Evie. Bennett - Dylan and Mackenzie and Lyttleton: Will C and Kate. And congratulations to the Student Leadership Board; Matilda, Ezra, Jack, Isabella and Clementine as Deputy Premier and Will M as Premier. I look forward to their leadership of student voice at Hagley for this year.

We currently have a number of staff on leave, for a variety of personal reasons. We are doing our best to ensure that learning continuity is in place and that we have consistency with relief teachers where we can. Our priority is to do everything we can to ensure every student's learning continues. For this reason, we currently have members of the school leadership team teaching on class above their usual responsibilities.

This week we begin a fortnight of NAPLAN testing for grade 3 and 5 students – the National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy. There is often a lot of external worries about NAPLAN and the results, but I want you to know that we encourage our students to have a go, to do their best and to be resilient during the testing period. We encourage every student in Grade 3



and 5 to be at school every day during this testing time, and to show their grit and determination by participating to the best of their abilities. The level of participation is important – we need all our students to be involved, unless they have been granted a formal exemption. The results give us information about trends in our teaching and learning, but individual outcomes are not as important to us as the day to day learning and participation of our students. The work that our teachers do together every week, enquiring into student learning in reading, writing and number, informs our ongoing interventions. NAPLAN is an important National

testing program; however, Hagley Farm School has many other ways to know what each of our students know and can do, and therefore what that means for the next steps in our teaching and their learning.

SAFEGUARDING TRAINING IN OUR SCHOOLS

We currently have less than 20 parents who have completed this training. It only takes 15 minutes to complete. If you volunteer in the class, on an excursion, at a school event, in the library or the canteen, you will need to do this training. You will need to complete your safeguarding training before working with any children or young people this year. Make sure you save the certificate to show you have completed it. You can either present it to the school office who will photocopy it, or email the school a copy Hagley.Farm.Primary@decyp.tas.gov.au
The training is compulsory under new laws designed to better safeguard children and young people in Tasmania. It will help you understand what to do if you believe a child or young person is or may be being harmed, and to make sure you are doing all you can to prevent this from happening. The training will also tell you what you must report under the new laws.

To complete your training, visit <u>Safeguarding Training</u> or scan the QR code in our newsletter and on our school's main office doors. The training is a 13-minute video, designed to help you better understand what to do if you hold concerns for a child's safety and to understand your Mandatory reporting obligations.


