# From the Principal

Hello everyone,

I would like to congratulate our Grade 3 and 5 students who have recently taken part in their NAPLAN testing. As a group they showed courage and persistence as they worked through online challenges; they had really strong attendance to participate in the testing, and they were resilient as they faced each test with optimism and positivity. The culture that our teachers and teacher assistants promote at Hagley supports everybody having a positive attitude and having the best go that they can. Well done everyone, and thanks to our parent community who supported participation with most students being at school each day of the testing. This is really important, and one of the measurements that schools are assessed against.

Last Tuesday evening our School Association held their Annual General Meeting. It was pleasing to welcome some new faces to our meeting and to the committee. I would like to thank our outgoing Chairperson, Mathew Dent, and Treasurer, Jane Heazlewood. Both Mathew and Jane have volunteered incredible numbers of hours in support of our association and been proactive in seeking financial support for our students through fundraising and grants. I have really valued the support of both Mathew and Jane representatives for the School Association. I would like to thank and acknowledge the volunteer time and commitment that the committee members have given to the school community over the past twelve months. After sending our concerns about cracks in the Old Classroom to the Facilities Department of DECYP, last week we had some significant news about the condition and safety for everybody. This building is such a special part of our school — being the original classroom of Hagley Farm School, which was built in 1865. We have had substantial work done to the building over recent years, but it



seems that the recent dry weather, as well as other factors, has contributed to some substantial cracks in the walls. This has been identified as a high risk, and at this point in time we are not able to access the main part of the building. Fences have been constructed to ensure no one accesses the site, until an engineers report is conducted and associated works are completed. We are all concerned and upset about the condition of our beautiful classroom. The heritage of our environment is a special part of our school culture. As I learn more about the condition of the building and the plans to restore her I will keep you informed.

At the end of this week, as we head into the Easter break, we have a few staff taking some longer leave. I hope that Mr and Mrs Ankin, and Mrs Mason have an incredibly enjoyable and relaxing long break. They will return to school in week 3 of term 2. Mrs Cini is also having a few weeks leave and will be back at school at the beginning of term 2.

I hope that all of our families and our staff have a really enjoyable and relaxing Easter break. I look forward to seeing our community back at school on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> April.

# **Evidence of Learning – CANVAS STUDENT**

This term all students will have an Evidence of Learning shared with home. Unless your teacher advises otherwise, these Evidences of Learning will be shared with families in CANVAS.

To be able to view these, you will need to be logged in to the CANVAS STUDENT app. You log into this app the same way you would CANVAS parent. Many users report that the functionality of CANVAS student is easier to navigate that CANVAS parent.

If you are still experiencing difficulty with CANVAS here are two things to try — try logging on from a home computer or laptop, if this works then try your phone and ensure your email address you are using is the same one we have on file here and is linked to a Microsoft or google account.

If you are still experiencing problems Mrs Beams will be running a day long drop in CANVAS help session on Wednesday the 3<sup>rd</sup> of April from 8.30 to 3.30. 
**Chess Club** – Mrs Marston and Alex H would like to remind everyone that Chess Club will be on again this Wednesday at 1pm in the library.
