## From the Principal

Hello everyone,

Welcome back to Term 2. It was a great return to school yesterday, and we were really excited to welcome Mrs Walker back to us and her Prep class, after having last term away.

We began our term together yesterday with a whole school assembly to remind and re-establish the expectations for our students for this term, and the remainder of this year. The key messages were:

We ALL come to school to be learners, all day, every day. Every learner. Every day. Every class. We ALL need to be at school every day unless we are not well. Every minute, hour, day that we miss adds up to significant loss of learning over the course of our time at school.

We ALL need to focus on how our behaviour effects the learning of the other people in our classes and around the school. We ALL need to be aware of how our behaviour and actions effect our teachers and their preparation and opportunities for explicit teaching every day.

We ALL need to be aware of how our actions effect the way our younger students play and learn at school, as they see older students as role models.

We have significant numbers of students who model the values of our school every day, in all of their actions, and I congratulate them for their positive approach and respect for our school, themselves, their learning and for others. Our teachers, teacher assistants and leadership will continue to focus on improvement of Respect for learning, and Respect for others as well as Respect for ourselves with ALL of our students. To be the best that we can be, and model the Values of our school – Respect, Responsibility, Courage, Growth and Connection, we need to continue to set our expectations high and ensure that we hold everyone to these standards.

We continue to provide messages to our families about the importance of being at school unless students are unwell. Every time away from school, for a few late minutes, or a day, or longer, has significant impact on learning opportunities for your child, and has a growing level of impact over our school lives.

I cannot wait for the biggest week of our School Association fund raising for the year. This is Agfest week. Thanks to every community member who has volunteered their time to support our Food Van and fund raising for our school students. Thanks to the School Association Committee who have worked tirelessly behind the scenes to make this week happen – it is a major project, and their focus over many months is very appreciated. ## CHANGE OF TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS

Last term there were a number of changes to travel arrangements. Most of the time these changes were well communicated, however, there were still some instances of confusion for our students.

## ATTENDANCE

In Term 1 we had over 50 children attend **less than 80% of days at school**. For students in Prep – Grade 6 this equates to at least one day off per week. Just one day a week can have a huge impact on your child's education. Across 13 years of schooling, one day absent per week would mean that student would miss over 2.5 years of school!

Futures begin at school so, if your child is well enough to attend school, being in the physical school environment is the best place for them. Every day matters.

## AGFEST

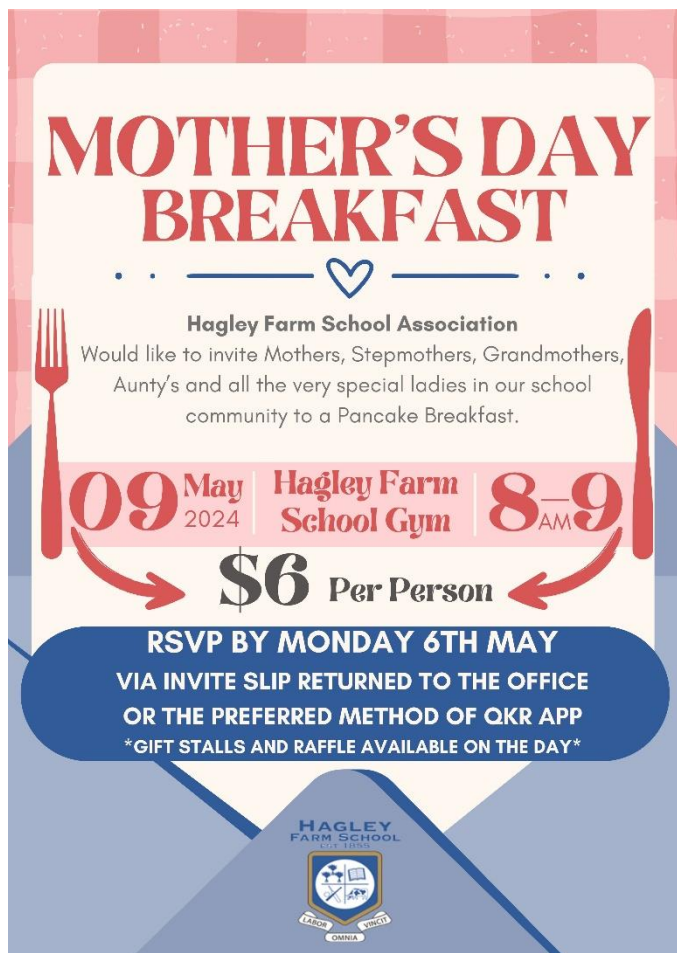
