

In 5/6 STyles we have learnt...

...that sugar, yeast and warm water makes dry yeast wake up and start budding. - Oscor

...that when yeast and sugar combine it has a <u>reaction</u> and makes a <u>gas</u> called CO². • Exie



I have learnt that the males give birth and that they have a swim bladder which allows them to move up and down by releasing and sucking in blood. I have that quite a lot of seahorses are teeny tirey and they can change their colour. • Ezro

...that a <u>zentangle</u> is a pattern used for a background in a shape to make it pop. They are usually in black and white, but also can be found in colour. - *(sobelle*)

__that yeast will bubble up. This happened because the warm water hydrated the yeast and the sugar helps it make a gas, giving it energy. -Month

...that decimal numbers are the numbers between two whole numbers that are a part. A decimal number is a number like 2.35 or 0.783. The way to tell which one is bigger is based on the decimal point. Out of 0.34 and 0.252 the first one is bigger because 3 tenths in bigger than 2 tenths. Between 0.30 and 0.37 the second one is bigger because 7 hundredths is bigger than 0 hundredths. - Griff



_yeast_combined with warm water and sugar gives yeast energy causing it to create bubbles and release carbon dioxide as well as alcohol. - Jude

...when you add sugar and water to yeast it will start to get bigger and carbon dioxide will start coming out. - Harley ...things about a platypus.
