Hello everyone,

Unwell – Stay Home

MID-YEAR REPORTS

The 9-point visual scale A-E ratings for students in Years 1 to 6 (and for Prep students at the end of the year). As there is no written report for Prep students at mid-year, we urge you to attend the parent/teacher/student conference in weeks 9 and 10 of this term. A written report will be issued for Prep students in term four.

The 9-point scale will show more specifically where your child's learning achievement is against the expected standard for their year level.

There will be **NO TEACHER COMMENTS** on the report. This term parent/student/teacher conferences will be offered in Week 9-10. These are a great opportunity to discuss how your child is progressing with their learning. We cannot stress enough to you the importance of attending these conferences, they are an invaluable way to learn more about your child's progress, learning and behaviour at school.


MOULD GROWTH IN 5/6 MARSHALL!

This term, we have focused on investigating the effect of physical conditions on the growth of living things including mould colonies.


We focused on variables as we planned and conducted investigations. We have also explored the work of other scientists including Dr Howard Florey and Anton van Leeuwenhoek.
