## From the Principal

Hello everyone,

### Welcome to Week Seven

This week we begin the first of a few weeks of Parent Teacher Meetings to discuss the learning progress of your children with you. Kindergarten meetings begin on Wednesday, with a later afternoon on Thursday, and then Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of next week. The following week (Week Nine) the Prep to Grade 6 Parent Teacher Meetings will occur. These will take place from Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> of June and finishing Tuesday the 2<sup>nd</sup> of July. The Tuesday appointment session will be our late session finishing @ 7pm. The other days will be after school hours.

These meetings are really important and highly valued by our school and staff. Communication between school and home is important all the time, however, this is an opportunity to focus specifically on learning outcomes and needs, to plan together for future goals and strategies to reach next steps in learning. Where appropriate we encourage students – especially from Grade 2 – 6 to participate in the meetings with parents and teachers. Learning attitudes, confidence and positive participation are so important to the growth for every child. Our Values of Connection, Responsibility, Courage, Respect and Growth are integral to these discussions about learning. Learning progress and participation shouldn't be a secret conversation only for parents and teachers. Please bring your child to the meeting to discuss their learning so far this year. Being included in the conversation supports them taking responsibility for their learning and enables them to contribute to the discussion.

We look forward to welcoming you to school to meet with teachers. If you have not yet made a time for your meeting it is not too late to do so. Please use the online booking system, contact the School Office by phone or teachers through Canvas to make a time.

## Smart Watches and Devices

I have to say that I am no expert regarding smart devices. I continue to use a traditional, simple analogue watch, preferring my communication devices to be separate to checking the time. However, recently our leadership team have become aware of a number of students at school who are wearing devices that allow for instant communications throughout the day from family members. It is important that the Hagley Farm School Use of Mobile Phone Policy for all devices is adhered to so that we can support our students to be responsible users of social media, and independent. The Department for Education Children and Young People's policy of Off and Away All Day is enforced at Hagley Farm School – which includes all smart devices. Students are required to hand in all mobile devices to the Office every day. The Hagley policy is currently under review – to include all devices, not just mobile phones. We will share this with the community in next week's newsletter.

If there is a medical reason for your child to require use of a smart device to be on their person, it is critical that parents speak with me to seek an exemption to the policy. Medical certificates or proof of the reason for the exemption will be required. Please ensure that your child does not have access to receiving from you or sending messages to you during the day through a smart device. If you wish to contact your child, please do so through the School Office.

All smart devices must be sent to the School Office every day. If they are found to be with a student they will be sent to the Office and returned at the end of the school day. Again, I reiterate that this is a part of the ***Department for Education Children and Young People's Policy of Off and Away All Day.***

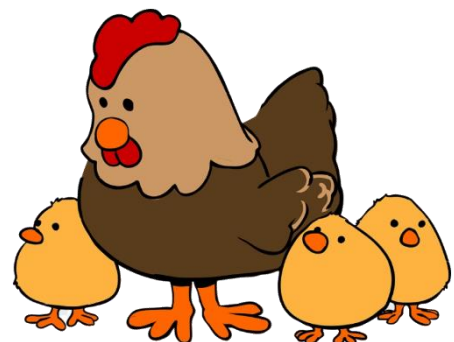
