Hello everyone,

This week's thoughts from me will be short, and very heartfelt.

Last week our school community was incredibly saddened by the passing of Lisa Gibson after several bouts of Cancer over the past eighteen months.

Lisa grew up in our local community. She attended Hagley Farm School with her brothers, Adam and Leigh. Lisa was a wonderful contributor to the school as a student, and she excelled at sports — most significantly being a fair team player and sportsperson. Lisa took this with her throughout her life — contributing significantly to sports communities throughout Tasmania.

About seven years ago Lisa returned to our school community as a parent when Mackenzie was in Prep, and Kai just a really little person. At this time, I was just so thrilled to reconnect with Lisa and her young family – Lisa had been a student in my grade 3 class in 1992 at Hagley. This is a special moment for any teacher – to reconnect and be able to appreciate the wonderful adult that their young student has become, and to see them reflected in their own children.

Lisa's parents Geoff and Robyn have been a major part of our school community for a very long time. Throughout many years they have both worked for our school and volunteered enormous hours of support.

On behalf of the Hagley Farm School, and the Agricultural Learning Centre, I express our heartfelt condolences to Mackenzie and Kai, to Robyn and Geoff, to Adam and Leigh and to their extended family.




We have been lucky enough to visit some fantastic historical buildings and sites around Hagley that have provided us with some excellent information on how people would have lived in the olden days.
