

THE YEAR 1 PHONICS CHECK: INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

If your child is in Year 1, they will be participating in the National Year 1 Phonics Check before the end of Term 3. This quick check looks at how well a child can 'decode' written words and whether they are making expected progress in reading.

Your child's teacher will use this information to identify and provide extra support to those students who need it. As part of the Check, students will be asked to read 40 words to their teacher – 20 real words and 20 made-up words. The teacher will listen to how students sound out the letter and letter groups and blend these sounds together to make words.

Using made-up words like "jound" is important as students cannot read these words from memory, they have to use their decoding skills.

Why is phonics important?

Phonics is the relationship between letters and sounds. Learning that there are predictable relationships between sounds and letters helps students decode words and spell them. Phonics is one of the essential components of learning to read.

How can I support my child?

Your child does not need to prepare for the Year 1 Phonics Check. It's not a test. It's a check-in on their progress. You can let your child know that the Check includes real words and made-up words.

The best way to support your child to become a confident reader is to spend time reading with them. Even a few minutes a day can make a difference to their learning.

We saw many native animals, dinosaurs, and animals from all over the world in the museums.







worth a visit in the school holidays.










