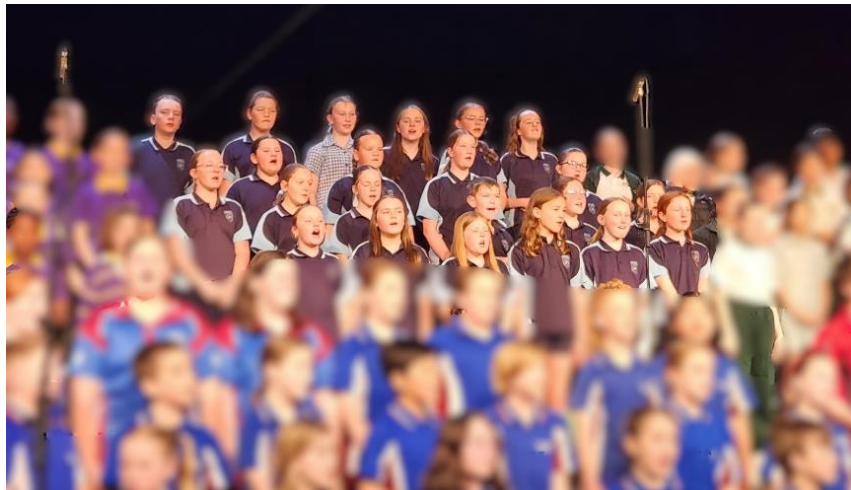
STUDENTS IN THE SPOTLIGHT
