# From the Principal

# Hello everyone,

Another great week at Hagley Farm School. Learning is our priority, and hand in hand with learning is attendance at school. We will be working hard with families this year to improve attendance for all students who dip below 90%. This equates to 20 days away from school – whether for sickness, holidays or other reasons.

We understand families heading away for long holidays, however, last year we had many students with more than 20 days away from school for other reasons. 20 days equals 4 weeks of learning. Parents and carers should expect to hear from our teachers when students are away regularly. This doesn't necessarily mean consecutive days; it may involve a day a week or a day a fortnight – which over time still adds up to huge loss of learning time. As always, we require parents and carers to inform the Office of the reason why students are absent from school.

Last week I wrote about a change to our end of lunch process, which includes an ECE and Primary 'Line Up' quick assembly. I am pleased to report to you that it is a great change to our processes, and we have seen fantastic response from our students, who get there fast – quite a change from our previous end of lunch routines.

In the past week we have had quick reminders about rubbish in the school grounds, reducing football physical behaviour, hats, being patient at the swings and sharing appropriately, reminded students to put their lunch boxes away at the end of breaks, and we recognised students who have been focused on our Values (with Token cards), and thanked some students for their kindness and support of others. It is a great new initiative in our school that supports our students following our expectations and values on a daily basis.



Next Tuesday afternoon we will co-host our Welcome Back to School Barbecue with our School Association. This is a fantastic evening where our teachers welcome families into classrooms and then have an opportunity to share a sausage or two with the parent and staff community. We always really look forward to this event. It is an exciting way for our families to connect with us, and to establish great relationships together for the year ahead. We really hope to see you all here with us for the barbecue. Please be aware that students must be supervised by parents and older school students (who do not attend Hagley) must still be supervised. This is essential to ensure that all our younger students feel and are safe in our environment. I thank you for your consideration of our school community and our family event.

The following day, Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> February, is a full day holiday. Please ensure that you put this holiday in your calendar.

# **VOLUNTEERING AT SCHOOL**

As we kick off the new school year, we want to remind our school community about the important requirements for volunteering at our school.

To ensure the safety and wellbeing of our students, it is mandatory for all volunteers to have their RWVP (Registration for Working with Vulnerable People) and to have completed the Our Obligations – Safeguarding Training 15-minute video before engaging with children and young people in a volunteer capacity at our school. Certificates for the training video are valid for 12 months from the date of completion. These steps are essential in helping us maintain a safe and supportive environment for our children.

# **HOUSE CAPTAINS**

Many of our Grade 6 students are currently preparing to give their speeches to our students in Grades 3 to 6 as part of the election process for House Captains.

Students will give their speeches this Friday. This part of the process is **NOT** open to our families to attend. This gives our students a smaller audience for what is already a daunting task.

Announcement of House Captains will be made on Friday the 28<sup>th</sup> of February in an assembly to be held in the Gym at 2.15. This assembly is open to all family members. Parents of students who have been successful in gaining a House Captain position will be notified prior to this assembly. We ask if you are one of these families, that you keep this information confidential, so it is a surprise to all students, including your own, at the assembly.

# LATE ARRIVAL/EARLY COLLECTION

Parents/Carers are reminded that if their child/children arrive late to school or they collect them early for whatever reason they must be signed in/out at the office. It is our duty of care to know which students are or aren't at school especially in the case of an emergency.



#### **CHANGES TO STUDENT TRANSPORT**

The end of the school day can get quite hectic, making sure that all our students go in the correct direction whether that be on a bus, waiting to be collected by parents or going to After School Care. Any changes to your child's usual arrangements must be communicated clearly to the school. This can be via a written note to the teacher or a phone call to the office as early in the day as possible. These messages cannot be relayed verbally by students, as they may get the information confused. Please do not rely on an email to your child's teacher during the day as these are often not checked during class times.

#### **eSmart Values**

A new eSmart Values document was created last year, with input from both staff and students (see below). This information has been read through and signed by students in our school and is a working document that will be referred to when students are using ICT. This is in place of the ICT agreement we have had in previous years.

We encourage families to read through the document with your children and become familiar with the language and expectations of how we use ICT.



#### **WELCOME BACK BBQ**

Our annual welcome back BBQ will be held on **Tuesday the 25**<sup>th</sup> **of February**. Classrooms will be open, allowing your child to give you a tour of their classroom, talk with you about their learning and introduce you to their teacher.

If you have a concern that you would like to discuss with your child's teacher, it is best to make an appointment for another day to enable the teacher to give you their full attention and adequate time.

Our Early Childhood classes (Kinder to Grade 2) will be open from 5.30pm to 6.15pm.

- Our Primary classes will be open from 6.00pm to 6.45pm.
- The Free BBQ will run from 5.15pm to 6.30pm.
- There will be tractor rides on the evening as well.
- Coffee and Ice-cream vans on-site

# Roasted Jerusalem Artichokes

- 400g Jerusalem artichokes
- ¾ cup olive oil
- 2 tablespoons dried thyme
- 1 tablespoon minced garlic
- · sea salt to taste

## **Directions**


- 1. Preheat the oven to 175 degrees C.
- 2. Scrub tubers and cut out eyes.
- 3. Cut tubers into 1-inch pieces.
- 4. Mix olive oil, thyme, garlic, and sea salt together in a large bowl; add Jerusalem artichoke pieces and toss to coat. Arrange coated pieces in one evenly-spaced layer on a baking sheet.

5. Roast in the preheated oven until tender, 35 to 45 minutes.
